

Here is the short form of the report:

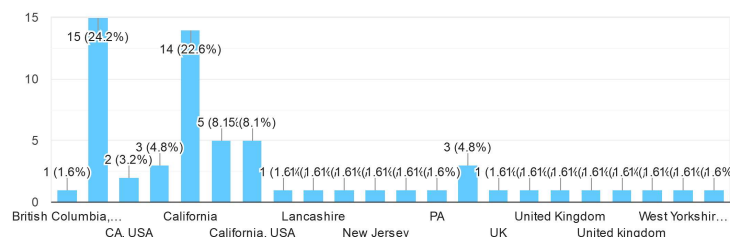
The 2020 SoCal Conference, themed "20/20 Clarity in Recovery" will be held June 12-14 (which is next weekend!).

On offer are six workshops, 3 speakers, and many optional marathon meetings, all in addition to the SoCal Assembly.

An **email blast** has been sent to those fellowship members on the LACC mailing list. We encourage SoCal and all Intergroups within SoCal to **please post the registration link on websites and send email blasts** as well. Additionally, we ask each of you as individual members to announce the event in any meetings you attend, and to encourage others to spread the word. As of 9:52am on Friday, 6/5 there are 52 people registered. (Future me here:) As of 10:27 there are 62.

You might be interested to know that while many are attending from California, we seem to have members coming from "as far as" the UK -- inasmuch as distance is real on the internet. So the word is getting around.

The **schedule** is a few details away from final. Some basic details (all times Pacific):
Main room will open around 5:45 pm on Friday with opening ceremony starting sometime between 6 and 6:30, depending on how concise we can get the virtual conference guidelines. The last Friday marathon meeting will end about midnight.
Saturday will run from 7:45am-10:30pm with SoCal Assembly from 12:30-2:30pm.
Sunday will run from 7:45am to 2:30ish or 4ish pm TBD. The difference is whether we find someone to run a marathon meeting from 2:30-4:00pm.
Generally, there are half-hour breaks between meetings with optional text-based chat fellowships.

Budget: We have only one **expense** -- two Zoom accounts. Depending on the number of people attending, this number will change, but (barring unforeseen circumstances) the total cost of the conference will be about \$130, and not exceed \$500. As for income, as of 10:10am on 6/5, we have already brought in \$509.38 in 7th Tradition contributions from 30 donors.

I would like to thank all of the members of the Conference Committee for their hard work and dedication to carrying the message despite the curveballs Higher Power has been throwing. I would like to thank SoCal for its support, encouragement, and flexibility in allowing us to find a way to make something happen. There are a lot of things we were unable to replace: count-up/count-downs, hugs, the ability to share intimately with stranger-friends. Yet we are including many things that I believe will be valuable to the fellowship, and I look forward to seeing how this all turns out.
